- (1) taking all forms of disciplinary action provided for in section 148.262, subdivision 1, and corrective action provided for in section 214.103, subdivision 6, against an individual's licensure privilege based on the grounds listed in section 148.261, subdivision 1, or any other statute authorizing or requiring the board to take disciplinary or corrective action; and
- (2) issuing a cease and desist order to limit or revoke a nurse's authority to practice in Minnesota.
- 2.13 (d) The board is authorized to recover from a nurse practicing professional or practical
 2.14 nursing in Minnesota under this subdivision the cost of proceedings as provided in section
 2.15 148.262, subdivision 4. The board shall promptly report any such actions to the state licensing
