1.1 A bill for an act

1.2 relating to public safety; appropriating money for juvenile delinquency treatment

1.3 homes and violence prevention and wellness efforts in Ramsey County.

1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.5 Section 1. **APPROPRIATIONS.**

1.6 **Subdivision 1. Ramsey County post-juvenile delinquency adjudication treatment**

1.7 **homes.** \$5,000,000 in fiscal year 2023 is appropriated from the general fund to the

1.8 commissioner of corrections for a grant to Ramsey County to establish at least five and up

1.9 to seven culturally specific, community-based intensive therapeutic treatment homes in

1.10 Ramsey County that provide up to 25 out-of-home, community-based placement options

1.11 for Ramsey County youth who have been adjudicated delinquent. This is a onetime

1.12 appropriation.

1.13 **Subd. 2. Ramsey County violence prevention and wellness support.** \$10,000,000 in

1.14 fiscal year 2023 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of corrections

1.15 for a grant to Ramsey County to award grants to develop new and further enhance existing

1.16 community-based organizational support through violence prevention and community

1.17 wellness grants. Grantees must use the money to:

1.18 (1) create family support groups and resources to support families during the time a

1.19 young person is placed out-of-home following a juvenile delinquency adjudication and

1.20 support the family through the period of post-placement reentry;

1.21 (2) create community-based respite options for conflict or crisis de-escalation to prevent

1.22 incarceration or further systems involvement for families; and

- 2.1 (3) establish additional meaningful employment opportunities for systems-involved
- 2.2 youth.
