1.6	Section 1. [119B.195] RETAINING EARLY EDUCATORS THROUGH ATTAINING
1.7	INCENTIVES NOW GRANT PROGRAM.
1.8	Subdivision 1. Establishment; purpose. The retaining early educators through attaining
1.9	incentives now (REETAIN) grant program is established to provide competitive grants to
1.10	incentivize well-trained child care professionals to remain in the workforce. The overall
1.11	goal of the REETAIN grant program is to create more consistent care for children over time.
1.12	Subd. 2. Administration. The commissioner shall administer the REETAIN grant
1.13	program through a grant to a nonprofit organization with the demonstrated ability to manage
1.14	benefit programs for child care professionals. The commissioner may use up to ten percent
1.15	of grant funds to administer the grant program.
1.16	Subd. 3. Application. An applicant must apply for the grant program using forms
1.17	developed by the commissioner and according to timelines established by the commissioner.
1.18	Subd. 4. Eligibility. (a) To be eligible for a grant, an applicant must:
1.19	(1) be licensed to provide child care or work for a licensed child care program;
1.20	(2) work directly with children at least 30 hours per week;
