A bill for an act 1.1 relating to education; recommending school counselor ratios; establishing school 12 counselor duties; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 121A.39. 1.3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA: 1.4 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 121A.39, is amended to read: 1.5 121A.39 SCHOOL COUNSELORS. 1.6 (a) A school district is strongly encouraged to have an adequate student-to-counselor 1.7 ratio for its students beginning in the 2015-2016 school year and later. The legislature 1.8 encourages school districts to have the following ratios: one school counselor for every 250 1.9 children in prekindergarten or preschool programs and students in kindergarten through 1.10 grade 12. When school counselor caseloads exceed the recommended ratios, school 1.11 administrators are encouraged to collaborate with school counselors to prioritize needs, 1.12 identify strategies that will have the largest impact, and engage other educators in the delivery 1.13 of the counseling curriculum. 1.14 (b) A school counselor shall assist a student in meeting the requirements for high school 1.15 graduation, college and career exploration, and selection, college affordability planning, 1.16 and successful transitions into postsecondary education or training. must provide preventive 1.17 and developmental school counseling programs to children in prekindergarten or preschool 1.18 programs and students in kindergarten through grade 12 in order to help them enhance their 1.19 academic, social and emotional, and postsecondary and career development as part of the 1.20 multitiered systems of support.
