1.6	Section 1. [121A.033] GENDER INCLUSION POLICY.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Scope and purpose. The gender inclusion policy is intended to ensure
1.8	student access to public school programming, activities, and facilities for each student
1.9	regardless of their sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, or gender
1.10	nonconformity.
1.11	Subd. 2. Definitions. (a) For the purposes of this section, the following terms have the
1.12	meanings given.
1.13	(b) "Gender" refers to the socially constructed roles, activities, behaviors, and attributes
1.14	that a given society attaches to femininity or masculinity.
1.15	(c) "Gender expression" means the external appearance, characteristics, or behaviors
1.16	typically associated with a specific gender.
1.17	(d) "Gender identity" has the meaning provided in section 363A.03, subdivision 50.
1.18	(e) "Gender nonbinary" refers to people who transcend commonly held concepts of
1.19	gender through their own expressions and identities. Other terms meaning the same thing

School policy. (a) A school district or charter school board, in consultation 2.13 with students, parents, and community organizations, to the extent practicable, must adopt, 2.14 implement, and where appropriate, review and revise on a cycle consistent with other district 2.15 policies, a written policy on gender inclusion consistent with this section. The policy must 2.16 require, at a minimum, a district or charter school to: 2.17 (1) respect all students' sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, and gender 2.18 nonconformity; 2.19 (2) identify and address students by their preferred names and pronouns that align with 2.20 their gender identity; 2.21 (3) upon the request of a student and their parent or guardian, change student names and 2.22 pronouns in school digital systems, to the extent possible, to align with their gender identity. 2.23 Medical documentation or legal verification of a student's name change is not required; 2.24 (4) within academic programming, prohibit the separation of students and curricular 2.25 materials based on gender unless it serves as a legitimate pedagogical tool; 2.26 (5) provide all students the opportunity to participate in cocurricular and extracurricular 2.27 activities in a manner consistent with their gender identity, including but not limited to 2.28 intramural and interscholastic athletics, and in conformance with applicable Minnesota State 2.29 High School League rules and regulations adopted under section 128C.02, subdivision 10; 2.30 2.31 (6) provide all students with access to facilities that align with students' gender identity;
