1.4BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.5Section 1. Laws 2019, chapter 64, article 1, section 2, subdivision 24, is amended to read:

1.6Subd. 24. **Concurrent Enrollment Courses**340,000340,000

1.7(a) \$225,000 in fiscal year 2020 and ~~\$225,000~~

1.8~~in fiscal year 2021 are~~ is for grants to develop

1.9new concurrent enrollment courses under

1.10Minnesota Statutes, section 124D.09,

1.11subdivision 10, that satisfy the elective

1.12standard for career and technical education.

1.13Any balance in the first year does not cancel

1.14but is available in the second year. The base

1.15for fiscal year 2022 and later is \$225,000 per

1.19postsecondary institutions currently

1.20sponsoring a concurrent enrollment course to

1.21expand existing programs. The commissioner

1.23the grant amounts. The commissioner must

2.22 23, subdivision 8. This is a onetime  
2.23 appropriation.
