A bill for an act  
relating to education; prohibiting public school employees from using public  
funds and resources to advocate to pass, elect, or defeat a political candidate,  
ballot question, or pending legislation; proposing coding for new law in  
Minnesota Statutes, chapter 123B.  
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. **[123B.022] PROHIBITIONS ON POLITICAL ACTIVITIES BY  
PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES.**

Local school boards shall develop and implement policies to ensure that publicly  
funded resources, including, but not limited to, time, materials, equipment, facilities, and  
e-mail and other forms of technology used to communicate are not used or authorized  
for use by public employees to:

- (1) advocate the election or defeat of any candidate for elective office;
- (2) advocate the passage or defeat of any referendum question; or
- (3) solicit funds for political purposes.

The policy also must define appropriate use and times of use of all computers at a  
school site with Internet access available for employee use.

Such policies shall not prohibit the use of public funds for disseminating factual  
information about a proposition appearing on a local ballot, if such information is factual  
and does not advocate for or against the proposition.

All school districts must make these policies readily accessible to the public.

**EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective six months following final enactment.
