1.6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.7	Section 1. [123B.022] PROHIBITIONS ON POLITICAL ACTIVITIES BY
1.8	PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES.
1.9	Local school boards shall develop and implement policies to ensure that publicly
1.10	funded resources, including, but not limited to, time, materials, equipment, facilities, and
1.11	e-mail and other forms of technology used to communicate are not used or authorized
1.12	for use by public employees to:
1.13	(1) advocate the election or defeat of any candidate for elective office;
1.14	(2) advocate the passage or defeat of any referendum question; or
1.15	(3) solicit funds for political purposes.
1.16	The policy also must define appropriate use and times of use of all computers at a
1.17	school site with Internet access available for employee use.
1.18	Such policies shall not prohibit the use of public funds for disseminating factual
1.19	information about a proposition appearing on a local ballot, if such information is factual
1.20	and does not advocate for or against the proposition.
1.21	All school districts must make these policies readily accessible to the public.
1.22	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective six months following final enactment.
