1.6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 169.444, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
1.8	Subd. 2. Violations by drivers; penalties. (a) A person who fails to stop a vehicle or
1.9	to keep it stopped, as required in subdivision 1, or who violates subdivision 1a, is guilty of
1.10	a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than \$500.
1.11	(b) A person is guilty of a gross misdemeanor if the person fails to stop a motor vehicle
1.12	or to keep it stopped, as required in subdivision 1, or who violates subdivision 1a, and
1.13	commits either or both of the following acts:
1.14	(1) passes or attempts to pass the school bus in a motor vehicle on the right-hand,
1.15	passenger-door side of the bus; or
1.16	(2) passes or attempts to pass the school bus in a motor vehicle when a school child is
1.17	outside of and on the street or highway used by the school bus or on the adjacent sidewalk.
1.18	(c) The fines collected for violations of subdivisions 1 and 1a pursuant to this subdivision
1.19	must be deposited in the state treasury and credited to the school bus stop-signal arm camera
1.20	grant account established in subdivision 9.
1.21	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective July 1, 2021, and applies to violations
1.22	that occur on or after that date.

2.2	Subd. 6. Violation; penalty for owner or lessee. (a) If a motor vehicle is operated in
2.3	violation of subdivision 1 or 1a, the owner of the vehicle, or for a leased motor vehicle the
2.4	lessee of the vehicle, is guilty of a petty misdemeanor.
2.5	(b) The owner or lessee may not be fined under paragraph (a) if (1) another person is
2.6	convicted for that violation, or (2) the motor vehicle was stolen at the time of the violation.
2.7	(c) Paragraph (a) does not apply to a lessor of a motor vehicle if the lessor keeps a record
2.8	of the name and address of the lessee.
2.9	(d) Paragraph (a) does not prohibit or limit the prosecution of a motor vehicle operator
2.10	for violating subdivision 1 or 1a.
2.11	(e) A violation under paragraph (a) does not constitute grounds for revocation or
2.12	suspension of the owner's or lessee's driver's license.
2.13	(f) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the fines collected for violations of this
2.14	subdivision must be deposited in the state treasury and credited to the school bus stop-signal

2.20	Subd. 9. Account created. (a) The school bus stop-signal arm camera grant account is
2.21	created in the special revenue fund, consisting of all money deposited under subdivisions
2.22	2 and 6, and any other money donated, allotted, transferred, or otherwise provided to the
2.23	account. The money in the account is annually appropriated to the commissioner of public
2.24	safety to provide grants to school districts, charter schools, and companies that provide
2.25	school bus services for the following purposes:
2.26	(1) to purchase and install stop-signal arm camera systems; or
2.27	(2) as reimbursement for stop-signal arm camera systems that have already been
2.28	purchased and installed.
2.29	(b) The commissioner may seek assistance from the commissioner of education in
2.30	administering the grants.
