1.12	Subdivision 1. Scope. For the purposes of sections 347.66 to 347.72, the terms defined
1.13	in this section have the meanings given them.
1.14	Subd. 2. Animal shelter. "Animal shelter" means any not-for-profit organization with
1.15	tax-exempt status under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code that: (i) accepts
1.16	animals into an animal-designated physical facility; (ii) is devoted to the rescue, care, and
1.17	adoption of stray, abandoned, unwanted, or surrendered animals; (iii) places animals in
1.18	permanent homes or with animal rescue organizations; and (iv) does not breed animals.

1.20	Subd. 4. Companion animal. "Companion animal" means a pet or companion animal

Subd. 4. Veterinary protocol. (a) A commercial breeder must establish and maintain 7.23 a written protocol for disease control and prevention, euthanasia, and veterinary care of 7.24 animals at each facility. The initial protocol must be developed under the direction and 7.25 supervision of the board. A commercial breeder must maintain a written protocol that is 7.26 updated at least every 12 months and that is signed and dated by the board or by a veterinarian 7.27 along with the commercial breeder. The written protocol must be available to the board 7.28 upon request or at the time of inspection. The Companion Animal Board must consult with 7.29 the Board of Animal Health on matters related to disease control and prevention. 7.30

(b) An animal sold or otherwise distributed by a commercial breeder must be accompanied
by a veterinary health certificate completed by a veterinarian. The certificate must be

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- completed within 30 days prior to the sale or distribution and must indicate that the animal 8.1
- is current with vaccinations and has no signs of infectious or contagious diseases. The certificate accompanying an adult dog that was not spayed or neutered must indicate that 8.3
- the dog has no signs of infectious or contagious diseases and was tested for canine brucellosis 8.4
- with a test approved by the board and found to be negative. The Companion Animal Board 8.5
- must provide copies of any disease-related testing, including canine brucellosis and other 8.6
- reportable diseases, to the Board of Animal Health. 8.7
- 8.8 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective July 1, 2021.

- The Board of Animal Health must cooperate with the Companion Animal Board in the 8.10
- transference of duties under article 1, section 8. This cooperation must include providing 8.11
- the Companion Animal Board with access to any documentation or record keeping: 8.12
- (1) related to the duties being transferred from the Board of Animal Health to the 8.13
- Companion Animal Board; and 8.14
- (2) collected and maintained by the Board of Animal Health relating to companion 8.15 animals. 8.16
