1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 256B.69, is amended by adding a subdivision
1.7	to read:
1.8	Subd. 6h. Continuity of care for seniors receiving personal assistance. (a) If an
1.9	individual 65 years of age or older is receiving personal assistance from the same agency
1.10	continuously during the six months prior to being newly enrolled with any managed care
1.11	or county-based purchasing plan, the managed care plan or county-based purchasing plan
1.12	with which the individual is newly enrolled must offer the agency a contract for the purposes
1.13	of allowing the enrollee to receive any personal assistance covered under the terms of the
1.14	plan from the enrollee's current agency, provided the enrollee continues to live in the service
1.15	area of the enrollee's current agency.
1.16	(b) This subdivision applies only if the enrollee's current agency agrees to accept as
1.17	payment in full the managed care plan's or county-based purchasing plan's in-network
1.18	reimbursement rate for the same covered service at the time the service is provided, and
1.19	agrees to enter into a manage care plan's or county-based purchasing plan's contract for
1.20	personal assistance.
