1.10	(1) promoting caregiver support programs that serve Minnesotans in their homes and
1.11	communities; and
1.12	(2) providing, within the limits of available funds, the caregiver support services that
1.13	will enable the family caregiver to access caregiver support programs in the most
1.14	cost-effective and efficient manner.
1.15	Subd. 2. Authority. The Minnesota Board on Aging shall allocate to area agencies on
1.16	aging the state and federal funds which are received for the caregiver support program in a

1.19	caregiver support services must be used in a manner consistent with the National Family
