1.6	Section 1. [124D.167] UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL FOR FOUR-YEAR-OLD				
1.7	STUDENTS.				
1.8	Subdivision 1. Child eligibility. A child who is at least four years old on September				
1.9	1 of that year and not yet enrolled in kindergarten is eligible to participate in Minnesota's				
1.10	universal all-day preschool program. The child may choose a program offered under this				
1.11	section or apply for an early learning scholarship under section 124D.165.				
1.12	Subd. 2. Revenue. A child who is eligible for universal all-day preschool under				
1.13	subdivision 1 who does not receive an early learning scholarship may enroll in a school				
1.14	district's program.				
1.15	Subd. 3. Qualifying preschool program. (a) A school district program that meets				
1.16	the following qualifications may provide preschool services and enroll eligible children				
1.17	under this section:				
1.18	(1) curriculum and learning standards must be aligned between the preschool				
1.19	programs and kindergartens;				
1.20	(2) programs must employ licensed early childhood education teachers by January				
1.21	<u>1, 2017;</u>				
1.22	(3) each child must be assessed at program entrance and again at program exit;				
1.23	(4) programs must offer comprehensive family services including developmental,

2.6	(b) Qualified preschool programs may lease space in order to establish a universal
2.7	all-day preschool program.
2.8	Subd. 4. Payment. (a) A school district may provide preschool services for eligible
2.9	children. A district may establish a new program where no existing reasonably accessible
2.10	program meets the requirements in subdivision 3.
2.11	(b) A qualified program that offers additional services including home visits, parent
2.12	supports, social services, and health referrals for the most at-risk children may receive a
2.13	bonus in the amount of ten percent of the per-child payment rate for each child served.
2.14	Subd. 5. Participation. A school district under this section may also participate in
2.15	the early learning scholarship program under section 124D.165.
