1.12	(c) "Package" means a container providing a means to market, protect, or handle a

(e) "Perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances" or "PFAS" means a class of

fluorinated organic chemicals containing at least one fully fluorinated carbon atom.

2.1	Subd. 2. <b>Prohibition.</b> No person shall manufacture, knowingly sell, offer for sale,
2.2	distribute for sale, or distribute for use in Minnesota a food package that contains intentionally
2.3	added PFAS.
2.4	Subd. 3. Enforcement. The commissioner of the Pollution Control Agency may enforce
2.5	this section under sections 115.071 and 116.072. The commissioner must coordinate with
2.6	the commissioners of commerce and health in enforcing this section.
2.7	<b>EFFECTIVE DATE.</b> This section is effective January 1, 2023.
2.8	Sec. 2. HEALTH RISK LIMIT; PERFLUOROOCTANE SULFONATE.
2.9	By July 1, 2023, the commissioner of health must amend the health risk limit for
2.10	perfluorooctane sulfonate (PFOS) in Minnesota Rules, part 4717.7860, subpart 15, so that
2.11	the health risk limit does not exceed 0.015 parts per billion. In amending the health risk
2.12	limit for PFOS, the commissioner must comply with Minnesota Statutes, section 144.0751,
2.13	requiring a reasonable margin of safety to adequately protect the health of infants, children,
2.14	and adults.
