1.5	Section 1. AVAILABILITY OF COVID-19 VACCINES TO SCHOOL EMPLOYEES.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) The terms defined in this subdivision apply to this section.
1.7	(b) "Contract employee" means an employee of an organization that provides
1.8	student-related services throughout the school year to a school, whose primary task is to

1.10	(c) "COVID-19 vaccine" means a vaccine against severe acute respiratory syndrome
