1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 241.026, is amended to read:
1.6	241.026 CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS DISCIPLINE PROCEDURES.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) For purposes of this section, the terms defined in this
1.8	subdivision have the meanings given them.
1.9	(b) "Correctional officer" and "officer" mean a person employed by the state, a state
1.10	correctional facility, or a local correctional or detention facility in a security capacity.
1.11	(c) "Exclusive representative" means an employee organization which has been certified
1.12	by the commissioner of the Bureau of Mediation Services to meet and negotiate with the
1.13	employer on behalf of all employees in the appropriate unit.
1.14	(d) "Formal statement" means the questioning of an officer in the course of obtaining a
1.15	recorded, stenographic, or signed statement to be used as evidence in a disciplinary
1.16	proceeding against the officer.
1.17	Subd. 2. Applicability. The procedures and provisions of this section apply to state and
1.18	local correctional authorities.
1.19	Subd. 3. Governing formal statement procedures. The formal statement of an <u>a</u>
1.20	correctional officer must be taken according to subdivision subdivisions 4 to 10.

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2.1	Subd. 4. Place of formal statement. The formal statement must be taken at a facility
2.2	of the employing or investigating agency or at a place agreed to by the investigating
2.3	individual and the investigated correctional officer and exclusive representative.
2.4	Subd. 4a. Complaint. A correctional officer's formal statement may not be taken unless
2.5	a written complaint signed by the complainant stating the complainant's knowledge is filed
2.6	with the employing or investigating agency, and the correctional officer and exclusive
2.7	representative have been given a summary of the allegations.
2.8	Subd. 4b. Witnesses; investigative reports. Upon request, the investigating agency or
2.9	the correctional officer shall provide the other party with a list of witnesses that the agency
2.10	or correctional officer expects to testify at any administrative hearing or arbitration authorized
2.11	to recommend, approve, or order discipline, and the substance of the testimony. A party is
2.12	entitled to copies of any witness statements in the possession of the other party and an officer
2.13	is entitled to a copy of the investigating agency's investigative report, provided that any
2.14	references in a witness statement or investigative report that would reveal the identity of
2.15	confidential informants need not be disclosed except upon order of the person presiding
2.16	over the administrative hearing or arbitration for good cause shown.
2.17	Subd. 4c. Sessions. Sessions at which a formal statement is taken must be of reasonable
2.18	duration and must give the correctional officer reasonable periods for rest and personal
2.19	necessities. When practicable, sessions must be held during the correctional officer's regularly
2.20	scheduled work shift. If the session is not held during the correctional officer's regularly
2.21	scheduled work shift, the correctional officer must be paid by the employing agency at the
2.22	officer's current compensation rate for time spent attending the session. Notification of a
2.23	formal statement must also be provided to the correctional officer's exclusive representative
2.24	and the exclusive representative shall be allowed to be present during the session.
2.25	Subd. 4d. Record. A complete record of sessions at which a formal statement is taken
2.26	must be made by electronic recording or otherwise. A complete copy or transcript must be
2.27	provided to the correctional officer and the officer's exclusive representative without charge
2.28	or undue delay. The session may be recorded by the investigating officer and by the
2.29	correctional officer under investigation.
2.30	Subd. 4e. Presence of attorney and union representative. The correctional officer
2.31	whose formal statement is taken has the right to have a union representative or an attorney
2.32	retained by the officer, or both, present during the session. The correctional officer may
2.33	request the presence of a union representative, attorney, or both, at any time before or during
2.34	the session. When a request under this subdivision is made, no formal statement may be
