1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.5 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 124D.09, subdivision 3, is amended to read:

1.6 Subd. 3. **Definitions.** For purposes of this section, the following terms have the meanings

1.7 given to them.

1.8 (a) "Eligible institution" means a Minnesota public postsecondary institution, a private,

1.9 nonprofit two-year trade and technical school granting associate degrees, an opportunities

1.10 industrialization center accredited by ~~the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools~~

1.11 a United States Department of Education recognized accrediting agency, or a private,

1.12 residential, two-year or four-year, liberal arts, degree-granting college or university located

1.13 in Minnesota.

1.14 (b) "Course" means a course or program.

1.15 (c) "Concurrent enrollment" means nonsectarian courses in which an eligible pupil under

1.16 subdivision 5 or 5b enrolls to earn both secondary and postsecondary credits, are taught by

1.17 a secondary teacher or a postsecondary faculty member, and are offered at a high school

1.18 for which the district is eligible to receive concurrent enrollment program aid under section

1.19 124D.091.

1.20 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.
