1.7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.8	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 124D.09, subdivision 10, is amended to read:
1.9	Subd. 10. Courses according to agreements. (a) An eligible pupil, according to
1.10	subdivision 5, may enroll in a developmental course under paragraph (b) or nonsectarian
1.11	course taught by a secondary teacher or a postsecondary faculty member and offered at a
1.12	secondary school, or another location, according to an agreement between a public school
1.13	board and the governing body of an eligible public postsecondary system or an eligible
1.14	private postsecondary institution, as defined in subdivision 3. All provisions of this section
1.15	shall apply to a pupil, public school board, district, and the governing body of a postsecondary
1.16	institution, except as otherwise provided.
1.17	(b) Notwithstanding subdivision 9, paragraph (b), a public school board and the governing
1.18	body of an eligible public postsecondary system may agree to offer developmental courses
1.19	under this subdivision. Notwithstanding subdivision 12, no postsecondary credit may be
1.20	granted for a developmental course taken under this subdivision. A developmental course
1.21	<u>must:</u>
1.22	(1) be in the subject area of writing, reading, or mathematics; and

2.25	(c) The board must provide in	dividual counseling to a	ny student who does	not receive
2.26	a passing grade in a supplemental	instruction course. The ir	ndividual counseling	must include
2.27	career and employment advice an	d guidance, and informa	tion on educational o	pportunities
2.28	available to the student.			
2.29	Subd. 3. Fees. The board shall	establish a fee to be cha	rged to each student	participating
2.30	in a supplemental instruction cou	rse. The fee shall not exe	ceed 50 percent of th	e average
2.31	cost of one course credit for an un	ndergraduate degree prog	gram course offered	at a state
2.32	college or university.

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3.1	Subd. 4. Developmental courses. If a student does not meet the criteria for inclusion
3.2	in a supplemental instruction course, the board may require the student to participate, at no
3.3	cost to the student, in adult basic education or a developmental noncredit course designed
3.4	as a prerequisite for either a supplemental instruction course under subdivision 2 or a
3.5	credit-bearing course. The board shall not require a student who has taken a developmental
3.6	course under section 124D.09, subdivision 10, to participate in adult basic education or a
3.7	developmental noncredit course in the same subject area. The board shall not require a
3.8	student to participate in adult basic education or developmental noncredit courses for a
3.9	period longer than one quarter or one semester.
3.10	Subd. 5. Report. (a) The board must annually report by February 1 to the chairs and
3.11	ranking minority members of the legislative committees with primary jurisdiction over
3.12	higher education policy with the following information from the previous academic year
3.13	for each system campus:
3.14	(1) the number of students participating in the supplemental instruction program;
3.15	(2) the number of students that received credit in a supplemental instruction course;
3.16	(3) the graduation rate of students enrolling in a supplemental instruction course, if
3.17	available;
3.18	(4) the graduation rate of students not enrolling in a supplemental instruction course;
3.19	(5) the amount of time, on average, that it takes a student enrolling in a supplemental
3.20	instruction course to graduate, if available;
3.21	(6) the amount of time, on average, that it takes a student not enrolling in a supplemental
3.22	instruction course to graduate; and
3.23	(7) the date of graduation and the name and location of the secondary school, including
3.24	the charter school from which the student graduated, or whether the student received a
3.25	general education diploma or was homeschooled.
3.26	(b) The board shall provide, for each reporting requirement under paragraph (a), clauses
3.27	(1) to (7), a breakdown of the student data by race and ethnicity.
3.28	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment. The
3.29	Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities must begin offering a
3.30	supplemental instruction program at each Minnesota State College and University campus
3.31	by the beginning of the 2019-2020 academic year.
