1.5	Section 1. SMALL-AREA CLIMATE MODEL PROJECTIONS FOR MINNESOTA;
1.6	APPROPRIATION.
1.7	(a) Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes, section 116C.779, subdivision 1, paragraph (j),
1.8	\$411,000 in fiscal year 2020 is appropriated from the renewable development account
1.9	established in Minnesota Statutes, section 116C.779, subdivision 1, paragraph (a), to the
1.10	Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota to conduct a study that produces climate
1.11	model projections for the entire state of Minnesota in blocks as small as ten square miles
1.12	in area.
1.13	(b) At a minimum, the study must:
1.14	(1) use resources at the Minnesota Supercomputing Institute to analyze high-performing
1.15	climate models under moderate and high greenhouse gas emissions scenarios to develop a
1.16	series of projections of temperature, precipitation, snow cover, and a variety of other climate
1.17	parameters over the rest of this century;
