1.8	Subdivision 1. Larger cities assistance account. A larger cities assistance account is
1.9	created as a special revenue account and established in the state treasury. The account
1.10	consists of money allotted, appropriated, or transferred through gift or grant to the account.
1.11	Money in the account must be appropriated to the commissioner of transportation by law
1.12	and apportioned among all the cities that are eligible to receive municipal state aid.

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(1) a \$6 filing fee is imposed on every vehicle registration renewal, excluding pro rate 2.1 transactions; and 2.2 (2) a \$10 surcharge is imposed on the fee for every vehicle registration renewal, excluding 2.3 pro rate transactions; and 2.4 (3) a \$10 filing fee is imposed on every other type of vehicle transaction, including motor 2.5 carrier fuel licenses under sections 168D.05 and 168D.06, and pro rate transactions. 2.6 2.7 (b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a): (1) a filing fee may not be charged for a document returned for a refund or for a correction 2.8 of an error made by the Department of Public Safety, a dealer, or a deputy registrar; and 2.9 (2) no filing fee or other fee may be charged for the permanent surrender of a title for a 2.10 vehicle. 2.11 (c) The filing fee and surcharge must be shown as a separate item on all registration 2.12 renewal notices sent out by the commissioner. 2.13 (d) The statutory fees and taxes, and the filing fees and surcharge imposed under 2.14 paragraph (a) may be paid by credit card or debit card.
