1.5	Section 1. [147.033] PRACTICE OF TELEMEDICINE.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Definition. For the purposes of this section, "telemedicine" means the
1.7	delivery of health care services or consultations while the patient is at an originating site
1.8	and the licensed health care provider is at a distant site. A communication between licensed
1.9	health care providers that consists solely of a telephone conversation, e-mail, or facsimile
1.10	transmission does not constitute telemedicine consultations or services. A communication
1.11	between a licensed health care provider and a patient that consists solely of an e-mail or
1.12	facsimile transmission does not constitute telemedicine consultations or services.
1.13	Telemedicine may be provided by means of real-time two-way interactive audio, and visual
1.14	communications, including the application of secure video conferencing or store-and-forward
1.15	technology to provide or support health care delivery, that facilitate the assessment, diagnosis,
