## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

- 1.9 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 16C.16, subdivision 6a, is amended to read:
  - Subd. 6a. **Veteran-owned small businesses.** (a) Except when mandated by the federal government as a condition of receiving federal funds, the commissioner shall award up to a six percent preference, but no less than the percentage awarded to any other group under this section, in the amount bid on state procurement to certified small businesses that are majority-owned and operated by veterans.
  - (b) The purpose of this designation is to facilitate the transition of veterans from military to civilian life, and to help compensate veterans for their sacrifices, including but not limited to their sacrifice of health and time, to the state and nation during their military service, as well as to enhance economic development within Minnesota.
  - (c) Before the commissioner certifies that a small business is majority-owned and operated by a veteran, the commissioner of veterans affairs must verify that the owner of the small business is a veteran, as defined in section 197.447.

2.12	(c) The commissioner may make rules that set time limits and other eligibility limits
2.13	on business participation in programs under sections 16C.16 to 16C.21.
2.14	(d) Notwithstanding paragraph (c), for purposes of sections 16C.16 to 16C.21, a
2.15	veteran-owned small business, the principal place of business of which is in Minnesota,
2.16	is certified if:
2.17	(1) it has been verified by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs as
2.18	being either a veteran-owned small business or a service-disabled veteran-owned small
2.19	business, in accordance with Public Law 109-461 and Code of Federal Regulations, title
2.20	38, part 74 <del>.; or</del>
2.21	(2) the veteran-owned small business supplies the commissioner with proof that the
2.22	small business is majority-owned and operated by:
2.23	(i) a veteran as defined in section 197.447; or
2.24	(ii) a veteran with a service-connected disability, as determined at any time by the
2.25	United States Department of Veterans Affairs.
2.26	(e) Until rules are adopted pursuant to paragraph (a) for the purpose of certifying
2.27	veteran-owned small businesses, the provisions of Minnesota Rules, part 1230.1700, may
2.28	be read to include veteran-owned small businesses. In addition to the documentation
2.29	required in Minnesota Rules, part 1230.1700, the veteran owner must have been
2.30	discharged under honorable conditions from active service, as indicated by the veteran
2.31	owner's most current United States Department of Defense form DD-214.

technical and nontechnical goods and services	s including, but not limited to, printing and
construction, broadly defined to include all ph	nases of the construction process. A county
board must establish a bid-preference program	m for veteran-owned businesses for any
capital project within its jurisdiction to impro	ve land or buildings paid for in part or in
whole with state funds.	
(b) The purpose of this program is to fa	cilitate the transition of veterans from
military to civilian life, and to help compensa	te veterans for their sacrifices including, but
not limited to, their sacrifice of health and tim	e to the community, state, and nation during
their military service, as well as to enhance ed	conomic development throughout Minnesota.
(c) The county board may direct the co	unty director of purchasing, or other
designated official within the county purchasi	ng department, to administer this program in
