Section 1. [299C.75] BACKGROUND CHECKS; INDIAN TRIBES.

- (a) When requested by a law enforcement agency of an Indian tribe with a reservation in the state, the superintendent shall perform a criminal history background check on a person seeking a license, employment, public housing, or other purpose as required under tribal law. When requested by the law enforcement agency of the Indian tribe, the superintendent shall exchange fingerprints with the Federal Bureau of Investigation for purposes of the criminal history background check. The superintendent shall recover the cost of a background check under this section through a fee charged to the Indian tribe.
- (b) For purposes of this section, "Indian tribe" means a tribe, band, nation, or other
 federally recognized group or community of Indians.
