1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 18B.33, subdivision 1, is amended to read:
1.7	Subdivision 1. Requirement. (a) A person may not apply a pesticide for hire without a
1.8	commercial applicator license for the appropriate use categories or a structural pest control
1.9	license.
1.10	(b) A commercial applicator licensee must have a valid license identification card to
1.11	purchase a restricted use pesticide or apply pesticides for hire and must display it upon
1.12	demand by an authorized representative of the commissioner or a law enforcement officer.
1.13	The commissioner shall prescribe the information required on the license identification
1.14	card.
1.15	(c) A person licensed under this section is considered qualified and is not required to
1.16	verify, document, or otherwise prove a particular need prior to use, except as required by
1.17	the federal label.
1.18	(d) A person who uses a general-use sanitizer or disinfectant for hire in response to
1.19	COVID-19 is exempt from the commercial applicator license requirements under this section.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment.
