1.8	Section 1. [135A.158] INFORMATION PROVIDED TO STUDENT PARENTS AND
1.9	PREGNANT STUDENTS.
1.10	A public or regionally accredited private postsecondary educational institution must
1.11	provide information according to this section to students who are parents of one or more
1.12	children age 12 or younger, and to students who notify the institution that they are pregnant.
1.13	The information must include a fact sheet on the legal rights of student parents and pregnant
1.14	students and a list of resources to support student parents and pregnant students. The list of
1.15	resources may include resources for prenatal care, child care, transportation, and housing.
1.16	This information must be available in languages that reflect the primary languages of the
1.17	institution's student body.

1.19	GRANT PROGRAM.
1.20	Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) The definitions in this subdivision apply to this section.
1.21	(b) "Low-income" means:
1 22	(1) has a family income equal to or less than 200 percent of federal poverty guidelines:

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2.1	(2) is a dependent child of a family who has a family income equal to or less than 200
2.2	percent of federal poverty guidelines.
2.3	(c) "Student parent" means a person who is a student at a postsecondary educational
2.4	institution and is a parent of one or more children age 12 or younger.
2.5	(d) "Student parent program" means a comprehensive program to provide assistance in
2.6	enrolling in a postsecondary educational institution, achieving academic success, and
2.7	graduating, for persons applying for admission to a postsecondary educational institution
2.8	who are pregnant or a parent of one or more children age 12 or younger, pregnant
2.9	postsecondary education students, and student parents.
2.10	Subd. 2. Grant program. (a) The commissioner of health shall distribute state funds
2.11	appropriated for purposes of this section as grants to eligible entities to fund activities that
2.12	support the enrollment, retention, academic success, and graduation of persons who:
2.13	(1) are pregnant or a parent of one or more children age 12 or younger; and
2.14	(2) are enrolled in or applying for admission to public or regionally accredited private

2.18	Subd. 3. Entities eligible for grants. To receive grant funds, eligible entities must apply

2.22	in Minnesota; or
2.23	(2) a community-based organization experienced in serving low-income pregnant women
2.24	or low-income parents.
2.25	Subd. 4. Uses of grant funds. Grant funds must be used for:
2.26	(1) campus child care services, including starting or expanding an on-campus child care
2.27	facility, providing public information about and assistance with accessing public child care
2.28	assistance funds, and establishing child-friendly study rooms, student parent support groups,
2.29	and on-campus lactation rooms. Lactation rooms funded under this section must be in a
2.30	space other than a restroom or toilet stall, must be shielded from view and free from intrusion
2.31	by others, and must include access to an electrical outlet;
2.32	(2) establishing, continuing, or expanding student parent programs;
