1.10	practitioner or mental health professional as defined in sections 245.462, subdivision 17,			
1.11	and 245.4871, subdivision 27, that seeks to change an individual's sexual orientation or			
1.12	gender identity, including efforts to change behaviors or gender expressions or to eliminate			
1.13	or reduce sexual or romantic attractions or feelings toward individuals of the same gender.
