1.9	LANGUAGES OTHER THAN ENGLISH; MULTILINGUAL ELECTION JUDGES.
1.10	Subdivision 1. Duty. The secretary of state or county auditor must contract with a
1.11	translator certified by the American Translators Association to develop voting instructions
1.12	and sample ballots in languages other than English, to be made available in polling places
1.13	during elections as required by this section. At a minimum, voting instructions and sample
1.14	ballots must be prepared and made available in print, electronic, and audio-visual formats
1.15	in the Spanish, Hmong, and Somali languages.
1.16	Subd. 2. Designation of language minority precincts. No later than 90 days before an
1.17	election, the secretary of state or county auditor, in consultation with the state demographer,
1.18	must determine the number of residents of voting age in each precinct who are members of
1.19	a language minority and who lack sufficient skills in English to vote without assistance.

APPENDIX Repealed Minnesota Statutes: 21-00545

204B.27 DUTIES OF SECRETARY OF STATE.

Subd. 11. **Translation of voting instructions.** The secretary of state may develop voting instructions in languages other than English, to be posted and made available in polling places during elections. The state demographer shall determine and report to the secretary of state the languages that are so common in this state that there is a need for translated voting instructions.
