1.7	(1) if imposition of sentence was previously stayed, again stay sentence or impose
1.8	sentence and stay the execution thereof, and in either event place the defendant on probation
1.9	or order intermediate sanctions pursuant to section 609.135, or impose sentence and order
1.10	execution thereof; or
1.11	(2) if sentence was previously imposed and execution thereof stayed, continue such stay
