1.8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.9	Section 1. [16C.067] CONFLICT-FREE MINERALS.
1.10	Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) The following terms have the meanings given them.
1.11	(b) "Conflict mineral" means a mineral or mineral derivative determined under federal
1.12	law to be financing human conflict. Conflict mineral includes columbite-tantalite (coltan),
1.13	cassiterite, gold, wolframite, or derivatives of those minerals.
1.14	(c) "Noncompliant person" means a person:
1.15	(1) who is required to disclose under federal law information relating to conflict minerals
1.16	that originated in the Democratic Republic of the Congo or its neighboring countries; and
1.17	(2) for whom the disclosure is not filed, is considered under federal law to be an unreliable
1.18	determination, or contains false information.
1.19	Subd. 2. Prohibition. No commissioner may knowingly procure supplies or services
1.20	from a noncompliant person.
1.21	Subd. 3. Notice. In any solicitation for supplies or services, a commissioner shall provide
1.22	notice of the requirements of this section.

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
