BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 325H.05, is amended to read:
1.8	325H.05 POSTED WARNING REQUIRED.
1.9	(a) The facility owner or operator shall conspicuously post the warning signs sign
1.10	described in paragraphs paragraph (b) and (c) within three feet of each tanning station.
1.11	The sign must be clearly visible, not obstructed by any barrier, equipment, or other object,
1.12	and must be posted so that it can be easily viewed by the consumer before energizing the
1.13	tanning equipment.
1.14	(b) The warning sign required in paragraph (a) shall have dimensions not less than
1.15	eight inches by ten inches, and must have the following wording:
1.16	"DANGER - ULTRAVIOLET RADIATION
1.17	-Follow instructions.
1.18	-Avoid overexposure. As with natural sunlight, overexposure can cause eye and skin
1.19	injury and allergic reactions. Repeated exposure may cause premature aging
1.20	of the skin and skin cancer.
1.21	-Wear protective eyewear.
1.22	FAILURE TO USE PROTECTIVE EYEWEAR MAY RESULT
1.23	IN SEVERE BURNS OR LONG-TERM INJURY TO THE EYES.

2.9	The tanning facility owner or operator shall provide each consumer under the age of
2.10	18, before initial exposure at the facility and as otherwise required in section 325H.081,
2.11	paragraph (b), with a copy of the following warning, which must be signed, witnessed,
2.12	and dated as indicated in the warning:
2.13	"WARNING STATEMENT
2.14	This statement must be read and signed by the consumer BEFORE first exposure to
2.15	ultraviolet radiation for tanning purposes at the below signed facility.

Sec. 3. [325H.081] CONSENT REQUIRED.
(a) Before allowing the initial exposure at a tanning facility of a person under the age
of 18, the owner or operator shall witness the person's parent's or legal guardian's signing
and dating of the warning statement required under section 325H.061.
(b) For a person under the age of 16, the consent required by this section expires
365 days from the date the warning statement is signed and dated by the parent or legal
guardian pursuant to paragraph (a) and must again be obtained by the tanning facility
for successive 365-day periods until the person reaches the age of 16 as a condition
for allowing the person to use the tanning facility. The notice required under section
<u>325H.061 must be provided by the tanning facility to the customer upon the expiration of</u>
any 365-day period under this paragraph.
Sec. 4. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 325H.09, is amended to read:
325H.09 PENALTY.
Any person who leases tanning equipment or who owns a tanning facility and who
operates or permits the equipment or facility to be operated in noncompliance with the
requirements of sections 325H.01 to 325H.085 325H.081 is guilty of a petty misdemeanor.
Sec. 5. <u>REPEALER.</u>
Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 325H.085, is repealed.
Sec. 6. EFFECTIVE DATE.
Sections 1 to 5 are effective July 1, 2015.

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APPENDIX Repealed Minnesota Statutes: 15-3036

325H.085 USE BY MINORS PROHIBITED.

A person under age 18 may not use any type of tanning equipment as defined by section 325H.01, subdivision 6, available in a tanning facility in this state.
