BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
Section 1. [256E.365] EMERGENCY SHELTER ACCESSIBILITY.
Subdivision 1. Accessibility guidelines. The commissioner shall create guidelines for
equitable access to emergency shelters and domestic violence shelters for individuals with
developmental and intellectual disabilities.
Subd. 2. County or state funding. An emergency shelter or domestic violence shelter
that receives county or state funding, including medical assistance reimbursements, must
comply with the following accessibility guidelines in order to provide access to shelter for
individuals with developmental and intellectual disabilities:
(1) provide sensory friendly space or access to sensory accommodation tools, upon
request;
(2) provide appropriate accommodation to the intake process based on shelter and client
need; and
(3) have a written policy and procedures for supporting individuals with developmental
and intellectual disabilities that are reviewed semiannually by all staff and volunteers with
direct contact with clients.
