1.5	Section 1. WOMEN ENTREPRENEURS BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT
1.6	COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM.
1.7	Subdivision 1. <b>Appropriation.</b> \$500,000 is appropriated from the general fund
1.8	in fiscal year 2014 to the commissioner of employment and economic development
1.9	to establish a women entrepreneurs business development competitive grant program
1.10	to facilitate the creation and expansion of high-growth, high-revenue businesses by
1.11	entrepreneurs who are women. This is a onetime appropriation and is available until
