1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. SUMMER SCHOOL AID.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Summer programming aid amount. (a) A school district, charter school,
1.8	or cooperative unit providing in-person instruction to its students is eligible for summer
1.9	programming aid.
1.10	(b) The summer programming aid allowance equals \$75,000,000 divided by the number
1.11	of students enrolled in Minnesota's school districts, charter schools, and cooperative units
1.12	during the fall of 2020.
1.13	(c) A school district, charter school, or cooperative unit's summer programming aid
1.14	equals the summer programming aid allowance times the number of students enrolled in
1.15	the school district, charter school, or cooperative unit during the fall of 2020.
1.16	Subd. 2. Uses of summer programming aid. A school district, charter school, or
1.17	cooperative unit receiving summer programming aid may use its summer programming aid
1.18	for:
1.19	(1) summer school activities, including traditional summer school, summer academies,
1.20	and academic day camps;
1.21	(2) community partnerships with businesses and organizations, including local businesses,
