1.1 A bill for an act
1.2 relating to environment; reenacting prior law prohibiting weather modification;
1.3 providing criminal penalties; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes,
chapter 42.

1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. [42.15] POLICY.

1.7 The legislature finds it necessary for the state to ensure public safety, human health, and
1.8 environmental welfare by protecting citizens against weather modification.

1.9 Sec. 2. [42.16] SOVEREIGN RIGHT CLAIMED BY STATE.

1.10 For the best interest of its residents, the state claims its sovereign right to ensure public
1.11 safety, human health, and environmental welfare and to protect its citizens within state
1.12 boundaries and in the airspace above state boundaries.

1.13 Sec. 3. [42.17] DEFINITIONS.

1.14 (a) For purposes of this chapter, the terms defined in this section have the meanings
1.15 given.

1.16 (b) "Modification" means performance or attempted performance of or an activity or
1.17 attempted activity in connection with the intentional placement, injection, release, or
1.18 dispersion, by any means, of a chemical, a chemical compound, a substance, or an apparatus
1.19 into the atmosphere or clouds within the atmosphere, including cloud or atmosphere seeding,
1.20 for the purpose of producing or attempting to produce a modifying effect to the composition,
1.21 motion, or resulting behavior of the weather.

2.1 (c) "Person" means a person; firm; association; organization; partnership; company;
2.2 public or private corporation; trust; or federal, county, city, or other public agency.

2.3 (d) "Weather" includes but is not limited to the atmosphere, clouds within the atmosphere,
2.4 temperature, barometric pressure, intensity of sunlight, wind, rain, lightning, hail, sleet, fog,
2.5 and frost.

2.6 Sec. 4. **[42.18] PROHIBITION.**

2.7 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a person must not engage or attempt to
2.8 engage in weather modification within the state's sovereign boundaries or in the airspace
2.9 above the state's boundaries.

2.10 Sec. 5. **[42.19] PENALTY.**

2.11 A person violating this chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor, and each day that the violation
2.12 continues is a separate offense.
