1.5	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 122A.07, subdivision 1, is amended to read:
1.6	Subdivision 1. Appointment of members. The Board of Teaching consists of 11
1.7	seven members appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate.
1.8	Membership terms, compensation of members, removal of members, the filling of
1.9	membership vacancies, and fiscal year and reporting requirements are as provided in
1.10	sections 214.07 to 214.09. No member may be reappointed for more than one additional
1.11	term.
1.12	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective January 1, 2019.
