1.20	Subd. 4. Methadone take-home. The weekly rate for dispensing a seven-day take-home
1.21	supply of methadone is \$39.29.

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2.1	Subd. 5. Methadone bundle. The weekly rate for administering or dispensing a seven-day
2.2	supply of methadone, substance use counseling, individual and group therapy, and toxicology
2.3	testing is \$244.56.
2.4	Subd. 6. Naltrexone injectable bundle. For a week in which a naltrexone injection is
2.5	administered, the weekly rate for the naltrexone injection, substance use counseling,
2.6	individual and group therapy, and toxicology testing is \$1,552.69.
2.7	Subd. 7. Buprenorphine take-home. The weekly rate for dispensing a seven-day
2.8	take-home supply of buprenorphine is \$80.53.
2.9	Subd. 8. Buprenorphine bundle. The weekly rate for administering or dispensing a
2.10	seven-day supply of buprenorphine, substance use counseling, individual and group therapy
2.11	and toxicology testing is \$285.80.
2.12	Subd. 9. Buprenorphine injectable bundle. For a week in which a buprenorphine
2.13	injection is administered, the weekly rate for the buprenorphine injection, substance use
2.14	counseling, individual and group therapy, and toxicology testing is \$1,948.22.
2.15	Subd. 10. Buprenorphine implant insertion bundle. For a week in which a
2.16	buprenorphine implant is inserted, the weekly rate for the buprenorphine implantation,
2.17	substance use counseling, individual and group therapy, and toxicology testing is \$5,403.44.
2.18	Subd. 11. Buprenorphine implant removal bundle. For a week in which a
2.19	buprenorphine implant is removed, the weekly rate for the buprenorphine implant removal,
2.20	substance use counseling, individual and group therapy, and toxicology testing is \$473.94.
2.21	Subd. 12. Buprenorphine implantation and removal bundle. For a week in which a
2.22	buprenorphine implant is both inserted and removed, the weekly rate for the buprenorphine
2.23	implantation, implant removal, substance use counseling, individual and group therapy, and
2.24	toxicology testing is \$5,634.20.
2.25	Subd. 13. Intake activity add-on. For a week in which both substance use disorder
2.26	treatment services with medications for opioid use disorder are provided and intake activities
2.27	occur, the weekly add-on for the intake activities is \$188.99.
2.28	Subd. 14. Periodic assessment add-on. For a week in which both substance use disorder
2.29	treatment services with medications for opioid use disorder are provided and a periodic
2.30	assessment is conducted, the weekly add-on for the periodic assessment is \$116.14.
2.31	Subd. 15. Additional counseling add-on. For a week in which both substance use
2.32	disorder treatment services with medications for opioid use disorder are provided and

For any month directly following a month in 3.19 which a payment was made under this section for services provided to an individual, the 3.20 subsequent monthly rate for office-based care coordination and at least 60 minutes of 3.21 individual therapy, group therapy, or counseling is \$383.45. 3.22 Subd. 5. **Presumptive drug tests.** The rate for medically necessary presumptive drug 3.23 tests to detect the presence or absence of a drug or drug class conducted in conjunction with 3.24 office-based substance use disorder treatment services with medications for opioid use 3.25 disorder are specified in clauses (1) to (3): 3.26 (1) the rate for a presumptive drug test using a device or procedure capable of being 3.27 read by direct optical observation is \$12.60 per test; 3.28 3.29 (2) the rate for a presumptive drug test using a device or procedure read by instrument-assisted direct optical observation is \$17.14 per test; and 3.30 3.31 (3) the rate for a presumptive drug test using a chemistry analyzer is \$62.14 per test.
