Subd. 3. Model policy required. By November 15, 2021, the board must develop a model policy for law enforcement agencies to implement the prohibition on law enforcement agencies and peace officers from using chemical weapons and kinetic energy munitions on civilian populations. The board must distribute the model policy to all chief law enforcement officers.

Subd. 4. Agency policies required. By January 15, 2022, the chief law enforcement

officer of every state and local law enforcement agency must establish and enforce a written policy that is identical or substantially similar to the board's model policy described in subdivision 3.
