1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. [97B.032] NONTOXIC AMMUNITION REQUIRED.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Lead ammunition prohibited. A person may not use or possess lead
1.7	ammunition when hunting with firearms.
1.8	Subd. 2. Hunter notification. The commissioner must notify hunters of the requirements
1.9	of this section.
1.10	Subd. 3. Civil penalty. A person who violates this section is subject to the following
1.11	civil penalties:
1.12	(1) \$500 for the first offense; and
1.13	(2) a penalty of at least \$1,000 but no more than \$5,000 for each subsequent offense.
1.14	Subd. 4. Nontoxic ammunition vouchers. (a) To the extent funding is available, the
1.15	commissioner must establish a program to provide hunters with nontoxic ammunition at no
1.16	cost or at a reduced cost. The program must include a voucher for nontoxic ammunition
