1.5	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 144A.471, subdivision 9, is amended to

1.7	Subd. 9. Exclusions from home care licensure. The following are excluded from
1.8	home care licensure and are not required to provide the home care bill of rights:
1.9	(1) an individual or business entity providing only coordination of home care that
1.10	includes one or more of the following:
1.11	(i) determination of whether a client needs home care services, or assisting a client
1.12	in determining what services are needed;
1.13	(ii) referral of clients to a home care provider;
1.14	(iii) administration of payments for home care services; or
1.15	(iv) administration of a health care home established under section 256B.0751;
1.16	(2) an individual who is not an employee of a licensed home care provider if the
1.17	individual:
1.18	(i) only provides services as an independent contractor to one or more licensed
1.19	home care providers;
1.20	(ii) provides no services under direct agreements or contracts with clients; and
