1.13 LICENSES AND IDENTIFICATION CARDS

1.14 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.04, subdivision 5, is amended to read:

1.15 Subd. 5. Temporary lawful admission. The commissioner is prohibited from issuing
1.16 a driver's license or Minnesota identification card to an applicant whose having a lawful
1.17 temporary admission period, as demonstrated under section 171.06, subdivision 3, paragraph
1.18 (b), clause (2), that expires within 30 days of the date of the application.

1.19 Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.06, subdivision 3, is amended to read:

1.20 Subd. 3. Contents of application; other information. (a) An application must:

1.21 (1) state the full name, date of birth, sex, and either (i) the residence address of the

2.2 any other facts pertaining to the applicant, the applicant's driving privileges, and the  
2.3 applicant's ability to operate a motor vehicle with safety;

2.14 (ii) indicate a desire to make an anatomical gift under paragraph (d); and

2.15 (iii) as applicable, designate document retention as provided under section 171.12,  
2.16 subdivision 3c.

2.17 (b) Applications must be accompanied by satisfactory evidence demonstrating:

2.18 (1) identity, date of birth, and any legal name change if applicable; and

2.19 (2) for driver's licenses and Minnesota identification cards that meet all requirements of  
2.20 the REAL ID Act:

2.21 (i) principal residence address in Minnesota, including application for a change of address,  
2.22 unless the applicant provides a designated address under section 5B.05;

2.23 (ii) Social Security number, or related documentation as applicable; and

2.24 (iii) lawful status, as defined in Code of Federal Regulations, title 6, section 37.3.

2.25 (c) An application for an enhanced driver's license or enhanced identification card must  
2.26 be accompanied by:

2.27 (1) satisfactory evidence demonstrating the applicant's full legal name and United States  
2.28 citizenship; and

2.29 (2) a photographic identity document.

3.3 Subd. 7. **Noncompliant license or identification card; lawful status.** (a) A person is  
3.4 not required to demonstrate United States citizenship or lawful presence in the United States  
3.5 in order to obtain a noncompliant driver's license or identification card.

3.6 (b) Minnesota Rules, part 7410.0410, or successor rules, does not apply for a  
3.7 noncompliant driver's license or identification card.

5.27 date of birth and a photograph of the applicant at the age the record was issued; and
- 5.28 (iv) a federal electoral photographic card issued on or after January 1, 1991; and
- 5.29 (22) additional documents as determined by the commissioner.

6.1 (b) A document submitted as a primary document under subdivision 9, paragraph (a),  
6.2 clause (3), may not be submitted as a secondary document under this subdivision.

6.3 (c) Submission of more than one secondary document is not required under this  
6.4 subdivision.

6.5 Sec. 7. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.07, subdivision 1, is amended to read:

6.6 Subdivision 1. **License; contents and design.** (a) Upon the payment of the required fee,  
6.7 the department shall issue to every qualifying applicant a license designating the type or  
6.8 class of vehicles the applicant is authorized to drive as applied for. This license must bear:  
6.9 (1) a distinguishing number assigned to the licensee; (2) the licensee's full name and date  
6.10 of birth; (3) either (i) the licensee's residence address, or (ii) the designated address under  
6.11 section 5B.05; (4) a description of the licensee in a manner as the commissioner deems  
6.12 necessary; (5) the usual signature of the licensee; and (6) designations and markings as  
6.13 provided in this section. No license is valid unless it bears the usual signature of the licensee.  
6.14 Every license must bear a colored photograph or an electronically produced image of the  
6.15 licensee.

6.16 (b) If the United States Postal Service will not deliver mail to the applicant's residence  
6.17 address as listed on the license, then the applicant shall provide verification from the United  
6.18 States Postal Service that mail will not be delivered to the applicant's residence address and  
6.19 that mail will be delivered to a specified alternate mailing address. When an applicant  
6.20 provides an alternate mailing address under this subdivision, the commissioner shall use  
6.21 the alternate mailing address in lieu of the applicant's residence address for all notices and  
6.22 mailings to the applicant.

6.23 (c) Every license issued to an applicant under the age of 21 must be of a distinguishing  
6.24 color and plainly marked "Under-21."

6.25 (d) A license issued to an applicant age 65 or over must be plainly marked "senior" if  
6.26 requested by the applicant.

6.27 (e) Except for an enhanced driver's license or a noncompliant license, a license must  
6.28 bear a distinguishing indicator for compliance with requirements of the REAL ID Act.

6.29 (f) A noncompliant license must:

6.30 (1) be marked "not for federal identification" on the face and in the machine-readable  
6.31 portion; and

6.32 (2) have a unique design or color indicator for purposes of the REAL ID Act.

7.1 (g) A noncompliant license issued under any of the following circumstances must be  
 7.2 marked "not for voting" on the back side and must bear no other indication regarding lawful  
 7.3 presence of the license holder:

7.4 (1) the application is for first-time issuance of a license in Minnesota, and the applicant  
 7.5 has not demonstrated United States citizenship;

7.6 (2) the applicant's most recently issued noncompliant license or identification card is  
 7.7 marked as required under this paragraph or subdivision 3, paragraph (g), and the applicant  
 7.8 has not demonstrated United States citizenship; or

7.9 (3) the applicant submits a document that identifies a temporary lawful status or admission  
 7.10 period.

7.11 (h) A REAL ID compliant license issued to a person with temporary lawful status or  
 7.12 admission period must be marked "temporary" on the face and in the machine-readable  
 7.13 portion.

7.14 ~~(h)~~ (i) A license must display the licensee's full name or no fewer than 39 characters of  
 7.15 the name. Any necessary truncation must begin with the last character of the middle name  
 7.16 and proceed through the second letter of the middle name, followed by the last character of  
 7.17 the first name and proceeding through the second letter of the first name.

7.18 Sec. 8. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.07, subdivision 3, is amended to read:

7.19 Subd. 3. **Identification card; content and design; fee.** (a) Upon payment of the required  
 7.20 fee, the department shall issue to every qualifying applicant a Minnesota identification card.  
 7.21 The department may not issue a Minnesota identification card to an individual who has a  
 7.22 driver's license, other than a limited license. The department may not issue an enhanced  
 7.23 identification card to an individual who is under 16 years of age, not a resident of this state,  
 7.24 or not a citizen of the United States of America. The card must bear: (1) a distinguishing  
 7.25 number assigned to the applicant; (2) a colored photograph or an electronically produced  
 7.26 image of the applicant; (3) the applicant's full name and date of birth; (4) either (i) the  
 7.27 licensee's residence address, or (ii) the designated address under section 5B.05; (5) a  
 7.28 description of the applicant in the manner as the commissioner deems necessary; (6) the  
 7.29 usual signature of the applicant; and (7) designations and markings provided under this

7.31 (b) If the United States Postal Service will not deliver mail to the applicant's residence  
 7.32 address as listed on the Minnesota identification card, then the applicant shall provide  
 7.33 verification from the United States Postal Service that mail will not be delivered to the

8.1 applicant's residence address and that mail will be delivered to a specified alternate mailing  
8.2 address. When an applicant provides an alternate mailing address under this subdivision,  
8.3 the commissioner shall use the alternate mailing address in lieu of the applicant's residence

8.14 portion; and

8.15 (2) have a unique design or color indicator for purposes of the REAL ID Act.

8.16 (g) A noncompliant identification card issued under any of the following circumstances  
8.17 must be marked "not for voting" on the back side and must bear no other indication regarding  
8.18 lawful presence of the identification card holder:

8.19 (1) the application is for first-time issuance of a Minnesota identification card, and the  
8.20 applicant has not demonstrated United States citizenship;

8.21 (2) the applicant's most recently issued noncompliant license or identification card is  
8.22 marked as required under this paragraph or subdivision 1, paragraph (g), and the applicant  
8.23 has not demonstrated United States citizenship; or

8.24 (3) the applicant submits a document that identifies a temporary lawful status or admission  
8.25 period.

8.26 (h) A ~~Minnesota~~ REAL ID compliant identification card issued to a person with temporary  
8.27 lawful status or admission period must be marked "temporary" on the face and in the  
8.28 machine-readable portion.

8.29 ~~(h)~~ (i) A Minnesota identification card must display the cardholder's full name or no  
8.30 fewer than 39 characters of the name. Any necessary truncation must begin with the last  
8.31 character of the middle name and proceed through the second letter of the middle name,

9.3 ~~(i)~~ (j) The fee for a Minnesota identification card is 50 cents when issued to a person  
 9.4 who is developmentally disabled, as defined in section 252A.02, subdivision 2; a physically  
 9.5 disabled person, as defined in section 169.345, subdivision 2; or, a person with mental  
 9.6 illness, as described in section 245.462, subdivision 20, paragraph (c).

9.7 Sec. 9. **APPROPRIATIONS.**

9.8 (a) \$267,000 in fiscal year 2019 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner  
 9.9 of public safety to implement the requirements of this act. This is a onetime appropriation  
 9.10 and is available until June 30, 2020.

9.11 (b) \$76,000 in fiscal year 2020 and \$77,000 in fiscal year 2021 are appropriated from  
 9.12 the general fund to the commissioner of human rights for purposes of Minnesota Statutes,  
 9.13 sections 171.12 and 363A.28, subdivision 11. The base is \$77,000 in each year for fiscal  
 9.14 years 2022 and 2023.

9.15 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** Paragraph (a) is effective the day following final enactment.  
 9.16 Paragraph (b) is effective July 1, 2019.

 9.27 noncompliant driver's licenses or identification cards are governed by section 171.12,  
 9.28 subdivisions 11 and 12.

10.1 Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.12, subdivision 7a, is amended to read:

10.2 Subd. 7a. **Disclosure of personal information.** (a) The commissioner shall disclose  
10.3 personal information where the use is related to the operation of a motor vehicle or to public  
10.4 safety. The use of personal information is related to public safety if it concerns the physical  
10.5 safety or security of drivers, vehicles, pedestrians, or property. The commissioner may  
10.6 refuse to disclose data under this subdivision when the commissioner concludes that the  
10.7 requester is likely to use the data for illegal, improper, or noninvestigative purposes. Nothing  
10.8 in this paragraph authorizes disclosure of data restricted under subdivision 11.

10.9 (b) The commissioner shall disclose personal information to the secretary of state for  
10.10 the purpose of increasing voter registration and improving the accuracy of voter registration  
10.11 records in the statewide voter registration system. The secretary of state may not retain data  
10.12 provided by the commissioner under this subdivision for more than 60 days.

10.17 with the power to arrest.

10.18 Sec. 4. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.12, is amended by adding a subdivision to

10.20 Subd. 11. **Certain data on noncompliant license or identification card; department**  
10.21 **and agents.** (a) The commissioner must not share or disseminate outside of the division of  
10.22 the department administering driver licensing any data on individuals indicating or otherwise  
10.23 having the effect of identifying that the individual applied for, was denied, or was issued a  
10.24 noncompliant driver's license or identification card without demonstrating United States  
10.25 citizenship or lawful presence in the United States.

10.26 (b) A driver's license agent must not share or disseminate, other than to the division of  
10.27 the department administering driver licensing, any data on individuals indicating or otherwise  
10.28 having the effect of identifying that the individual applied for, was denied, or was issued a

 11.4 subdivision, any state agency as defined in section 13.02, subdivision 17, or any federal  
 11.5 entity.

 11.27 card without demonstrating United States citizenship or lawful presence in the United States;

 11.30 in section 171.07, subdivision 1, paragraph (g), or 3, paragraph (g).

12.7 or federal law or policies of the department; or

12.27 individual maintains residence, by completing a registration application, making an oath in  
12.28 the form prescribed by the secretary of state and providing proof of residence. An individual  
12.29 may prove residence for purposes of registering by:

13.1 (1) presenting a driver's license or Minnesota identification card issued pursuant to  
13.2 section 171.07 that is not marked as provided in section 171.07, subdivision 1, paragraph  
13.3 (g), or 3, paragraph (g);

13.4 (2) presenting any document approved by the secretary of state as proper identification;

13.5 (3) presenting one of the following:

13.6 (i) a current valid student identification card from a postsecondary educational institution  
13.7 in Minnesota, if a list of students from that institution has been prepared under section  
13.8 135A.17 and certified to the county auditor in the manner provided in rules of the secretary  
13.9 of state; or

13.10 (ii) a current student fee statement that contains the student's valid address in the precinct  
13.11 together with a picture identification card; or

13.12 (4) having a voter who is registered to vote in the precinct, or an employee employed  
13.13 by and working in a residential facility in the precinct and vouching for a resident in the  
13.14 facility, sign an oath in the presence of the election judge vouching that the voter or employee

**171.015 DRIVER'S LICENSE DIVISION.**

Subd. 7. **Rulemaking limitation.** (a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the commissioner is prohibited from adopting any final rule that amends, conflicts with, or has the effect of modifying requirements in Minnesota Rules, parts 7410.0100 to 7410.0800.

(b) This subdivision does not constitute authorization for the commissioner to adopt rules absent authority otherwise provided by other law.
