1.6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.7	Section 1. RECONCILIATION OF MINNESOTACARE PREMIUMS.
1.8	Subdivision 1. Reconciliation required. The commissioner of human services shall
1.9	reconcile all MinnesotaCare premiums paid or due for health coverage provided during the
1.10	period January 1, 2014, through December 31, 2017, by July 1, 2018. Based on this
1.11	reconciliation, the commissioner shall notify each MinnesotaCare enrollee or former enrollee
1.12	of any amount owed as premiums, refund to the enrollee or former enrollee any premium
1.13	overpayment, and enter into a payment arrangement with the enrollee or former enrollee as
1.14	necessary.
1.15	Subd. 2. Determination of compliance; contingent transfer. The commissioner of
1.16	management and budget shall determine whether the commissioner of human services has
1.17	complied with the requirements of subdivision 1. If the commissioner of management and
1.18	budget determines that the commissioner of human services is not in compliance with
1.19	subdivision 1, the commissioner of management and budget shall transfer \$10,000 from
1.20	the central office operations account of the Department of Human Services to the premium
1.21	security plan account established under Minnesota Statutes, section 62E.25, for each business
1.22	day of noncompliance.
