1.6	Section 1. [325F.174] DEFINITIONS.
1.7	(a) For the purposes of sections 325F.174 to 325F.176, the following terms have
1.8	the meanings given them.
1.9	(b) "Child" means a person under 12 years of age.
1.10	(c) "Children's product" means a consumer product intended for use by a child, such
1.11	as baby products, toys, car seats, crib sheets, personal care products, and clothing.
1.12	<b>EFFECTIVE DATE.</b> This section is effective the day following final enactment.
1.13	Sec. 2. [325F.175] FORMALDEHYDE IN CHILDREN'S PRODUCTS.
1.14	By January 1, 2013, no manufacturer may sell or offer for sale in this state a
1.15	children's product that contains formaldehyde.
1.16	<b>EFFECTIVE DATE.</b> This section is effective the day following final enactment.
1.17	Sec. 3. [325F.176] REPLACEMENT CHEMICALS.
1.18	A manufacturer shall not replace formaldehyde as a result of the prohibitions in
1.19	section 325F.175 with a chemical that has been identified as a priority chemical under
1.20	section 116.9403.
1.21	<b>EFFECTIVE DATE.</b> This section is effective the day following final enactment.

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
