Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 302A.461, subdivision 6, is amended to read:

Subd. 6. **Computerized records.** The records maintained by a corporation, including its share register, financial records, and minute books, may utilize any information storage technique, including, for example, <u>electronic records</u>, punched holes, printed or magnetized spots, or micro-images, even though that makes them illegible visually, if the records can be converted accurately and within a reasonable time, into a form that is legible visually and whose contents are assembled by related subject matter to permit convenient use by people in the normal course of business. A corporation shall convert<u>or prepare</u> any of the records referred to in subdivision 4 upon the request of a person entitled to inspect them, and the expense of the conversion shall be borne by the person who bears the expense of copying pursuant to subdivision 5. A copy of the conversion <u>or preparation</u> is admissible in evidence, and shall be accepted for all other purposes, to the same extent as the existing or original records would be if they were legible visually.
