1.7	Section 1. [145.661] VACCINE REQUIREMENTS FOR COVID-19 AND
1.8	INFLUENZA PROHIBITED.
1.9	Subdivision 1. Prohibited acts. (a) The state, a state agency or entity, a political
1.10	subdivision, a state or local official, a business, an educational institution, or a medical
1.11	facility shall not:
1.12	(1) require an individual to receive a vaccine for COVID-19 or influenza; or
1.13	(2) discriminate against or coerce an individual for refusing to receive a vaccine for
1.14	COVID-19 or influenza, including:
1.15	(i) coercing an employee into consenting to receive a vaccine for COVID-19 or influenza;
1.16	(ii) withholding the opportunity for career advancement from an employee who does
1.17	not consent to receive a vaccine for COVID-19 or influenza; or
1.18	(iii) withholding a salary, wage increase, insurance coverage, or insurance discounts
1.19	from an employee who does not consent to receive a vaccine for COVID-19 or influenza.
1.20	(b) Receiving a vaccine for COVID-19 or influenza shall not be a condition of receiving

2.6	COVID-19 or influenza, the individual or entity recommending the vaccine for COVID-19
2.7	or influenza must also provide a notice that this vaccine is not mandatory.

2.11	Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) For purposes of this section and sections 145.663 and
2.12	145.664, the following terms have the meanings given.
2.13	(b) "Local unit of government" has the meaning given in section 4A.07, subdivision 1.
2.14	(c) "Vaccine passport," "vaccine pass," or "vaccine credential" means proof that an
2.15	individual has tested negative for a contagious disease, received a vaccine against a
2.16	contagious disease, or is in post-transmission recovery from a contagious disease.
2.17	Subd. 2. Government-issued vaccine passport, vaccine pass, or vaccine credential. (a)
2.18	In order to protect the fundamental rights and privacies of Minnesotans and because
2.19	vaccination status is protected health information, no government entity or its subdivisions,
2.20	agents, designees, or assigns are permitted to issue or require use of vaccine passports,
2.21	vaccine passes, or vaccine credentials in any format, including in electronic format, digital
2.22	format such as a cell phone application, or physical format such as a paper card.
2.23	(b) Funds from the state treasury, federal funds, funds from a local political subdivision,
2.24	or funds from their agents, designees, or assigns shall not be used to fund a database,
2.25	infrastructure, or any supporting technology pertaining to vaccine passports, vaccine passes,
2.26	or vaccine credentials.
2.27	Subd. 3. Businesses. In order to protect the fundamental rights and privacies of
2.28	Minnesotans and because vaccination status is protected health information, no entity doing
2.29	business in Minnesota, including a nonprofit organization, shall require patrons, customers,
2.30	employees, contractors, or staff to provide a vaccine passport, vaccine pass, or vaccine
2.31	credential to gain access to, entry upon, or service from the business. This prohibition also
2.32	applies to travel by air, train, water, or rental car.
