Subd. 6. **Fees.** The annual fees for licenses under this section are as follows:

(a) Manufacturers (except as provided in clauses (b)

2.8 If a business licensed under this section is destroyed, or damaged to the extent that
2.9 it cannot be carried on, or if it ceases because of the death or illness of the licensee, the
2.10 commissioner may refund the license fee for the balance of the license period to the
2.11 licensee or to the licensee's estate.

2.12 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective on July 1, 2012.
