1.11	state or other alleged illegal actions that contributed to the excessive use of opioids.
1.12	(d) "Released claim" means any cause of action or other claim that has been released in
1.13	a statewide opioid settlement agreement, including matters identified as a released claim as
1.14	that term or a comparable term is defined in a statewide opioid settlement agreement.
1.15	(e) "Settling defendant" means Johnson & Johnson, AmerisourceBergen Corporation,
1.16	Cardinal Health, Inc., and McKesson Corporation, Teva Pharmaceuticals, Allergan plc,
1.17	CVS Health Corporation, Walgreens Boots Alliance, Inc., and Walmart, Inc., as well as
1.18	related subsidiaries, affiliates, officers, directors, and other related entities specifically named
