1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 340A.404, subdivision 12, is amended to
1.6	read:
1.7	Subd. 12. Caterer's permit. (a) The commissioner may issue a caterer's permit to a
1.8	restaurant that holds an on-sale intoxicating liquor license issued by any municipality caterer
1.9	of alcoholic beverages. The holder of a caterer's permit may sell intoxicating liquor as an
1.10	incidental part of a food service that serves prepared meals at a place other than the premises
1.11	for which the holder's on-sale intoxicating liquor license is issued.
1.12	(a) A caterer's permit is auxiliary to the primary on-sale license held by the licensee.
1.13	(b) The restrictions and regulations which apply to the sale of intoxicating liquor on the
1.14	<u>a</u> licensed premises also apply to the sale under the authority of a caterer's permit, and any
1.15	act that is prohibited on the a licensed premises is also prohibited when the licensee is
1.16	operating other than on the a licensed premises under a caterer's permit. All laws not
1.17	inconsistent with this subdivision that apply to an on-sale licensee also apply to the holder
1.18	of a caterer's permit.
1.19	(c) Any act, which if done on the a licensed premises would be grounds for cancellation
1.20	or suspension of the an on-sale licensee, is grounds for cancellation of both the on-sale
1.21	license and the caterer's permit if done when the permittee is operating away from the
1.22	licensed premises under the authority of the caterer's permit.

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- 2.1 (d) The permittee shall notify prior to any catered event:
- 2.2 (1) the police chief of the city where the event will take place, if the event will take place within the corporate limits of a city; or
- 2.4 (2) the county sheriff of the county where the event will take place, if the event will be outside the corporate limits of any city.
- (e) If the primary license ceases to be valid for any reason, the caterer's permit ceases
 to be valid.
- 2.8 (f) (e) Permits issued under this subdivision are subject to all laws and ordinances
 2.9 governing the sale of intoxicating liquor except those laws and ordinances which by their
 2.10 nature are not applicable.
- 2.11 $\frac{\text{(g)}(f)}{\text{The annual state fee for a caterer's permit is $300.}}$
- 2.12 (g) Nothing in this subdivision prohibits the commissioner from issuing a caterer's permit
 2.13 to a restaurant that holds an on-sale intoxicating liquor license issued by a municipality.
