By January 1 each year, 2.23 MESERB must submit a report summarizing its findings in each permit review performed 2.24 in the previous calendar year to the commissioner of the Pollution Control Agency and to 2.25 the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with jurisdiction 2.26 over capital investment and environment finance and policy. 2.27 (d) This appropriation is available until expended.
