BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 473.408, is amended by adding a subdivision
to read:

Subd. 11. Campus zone pass. (a) Subject to an agreement on costs as provided in
paragraph (b), the council must implement passes for light rail transit in the University of
Minnesota campus. The zone for the passes must include (1) each station located within the
campus, and (2) at least one additional contiguous station.
(b) Costs to implement the requirements of this subdivision must be divided 50 percent
to the council and 50 percent to the University of Minnesota.

EFFECTIVE DATE; APPLICATION. This section is effective August 1, 2020, and
applies in the counties of Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey, Scott, and Washington.
Sec. 2. CAMPUS ZONE PASS COSTS ASSESSMENT.

By February 1, 2021, the Metropolitan Council must submit a report to the chairs, ranking

minority members, and staff of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over transportation

policy and finance concerning costs and foregone revenue due to implementing an expanded

campus zone pass program as required under Minnesota Statutes, section 473.408,
