1.9	Subdivision 1. Issuance, suspensions, and revocations. (a) Annually by February 15
1.10	the commissioner of public safety must report to the chairs and ranking minority members
1.11	of the house of representatives and senate committees with jurisdiction over public safety
1.12	and transportation on the status of driver's licenses issued, suspended, and revoked. The
1.13	commissioner must make the report available on the department's Web site.
